A university education is a big investment in your future. It is important to consider the cost of a university education and make sure that you have planned carefully for all your expenses.

Estimating the cost of a year of study varies from student to student and depends on the program you are interested in. Here is a breakdown of your tuition costs and other fees to help you in your planning.

Here is an example of the average college expenses for a first-year student:
